Library Features



- The ASU Library has circulating collections on both the 2nd and 3rd floor of the library.
- The library uses the Library of Congress classification system – “Find It” aids are posted throughout the library.
- A – P call numbers for circulating collection are on the 2nd floor of the library.
- Q –Z call numbers for circulating collection are on the 3rd floor of the library.
- Books, Audiovisual/DVD materials – circulate for 2 weeks and can be renewed.
- Reference books (do not circulate) – 3rd floor.
- Print Periodicals -3rd Floor; Periodicals circulate on a case-by-case basis.
- Special collections –used in library and use is proctored.
- Networked multifunctional devices, print/scan/email: 2nd floor computers are networked to 2nd floor MFD, 3rd floor student computers networked to 3rd floor MFD.

Library Subject Headings



The ASU Library and most academic libraries use the **Library of Congress Classification** system instead of Dewey but it works in a similar fashion. You will find these main classes (see below) in the library. For example, the books on the shelf with the “call letter” starting with “U” will be have something to do with the topic of military science. The books starting with the call letter “T” will in some way be about technology, and so on.

D-DR: World History and History of Europe

Research to Support Writing



Choose topics you argue succinctly with confidence.

It is easier to make a case for something that matters to you and/or your work.

Avoid large, unwieldy topics that would require deeper exploration, explanation beyond the bounds of the assignment.

Back up your opinions with evidence.

The ASU Library can make your life easier and help you succeed with the assignment.

- Librarians and staff will help you find resources, show you how to use those resources or answer any other questions you might have.
- The library has print books, e-books, databases and other resources.
- Indexes and articles tend to have excellent information for the argument assignment as they are generally brief, current, and give the researcher enough information without having to go in depth. However, books can also be useful depending on the topic.

Library databases: searchable electronic indices of published, reliable resources providing a wealth of useful research from academic journals, trade journals, newspapers, and magazines. Often with full-text, abstracting, email and citation capabilities.

- **EBSCO**

EBSCO is the provider of research databases, e-journals, magazines subscriptions, e-books, and discovery service including the full text of Military, Government, & other government publications including newspapers.

- **ProQuest ABI/Inform Global**

ProQuest provides scholarly journals, newspapers, reports, working papers, digitized historical primary sources, 450k+ e-books in subject areas including Military, business, logistics, economic management, and corporate strategies.

- **JSTOR**

Includes JSTOR Security Studies, Arts and Sciences Collections I, II and IV. Go-to resource for primary and secondary academic research.

- **Country Watch**

Excellent source of current demographic, political, economic, business, cultural, & Environmental information. Includes political intelligence briefings, elections info, economic forecast, maps, videos, podcasts, and more.

In the Advanced Search function EBSCO enables you to refine your search by limiting your key words to the Title & Abstract or other areas (see right). You can also limit your search by other features such as date. You can use Boolean search strings (AND, OR, NOT) to search terms. Using variations of a concept/term will broaden your search and using quotations in EBSCO will ensure it searches the exact phrase. Within the quotations you see the * which is called a "wildcard" or truncation and will search any variation of letters attached to the root word "literac" such as literacy and literacies as they may show up on different forms in the search results and you don't want to miss them. You may find that you will have to broaden or narrow your search depending on your results. Database search is an iterative process and we can often help you uncover more information than you realize is available.

Search

ProQuest offers many of the same search features as EBSCO. An example precision search using “contested logistics” AND (INDOPACOM OR “indo pacific” searching only the abstract returned five results. The researchers were looking for more, so when clicking on a relevant article, they see that to the right of that article (in the image to the right) that ProQuest shows subject headings relevant to logistics discussed within the article, locations relevant to INDOPACOM, and the organization in the article. The researcher could check any/all of these boxes to search these terms by Subject, Locations, and Organization to broaden their search and return more results that may be relevant to their research.





Citation Assistance



Look for the quotation marks! When you see these in EBSCO, ABI Inform ProQuest and other databases clicking on the quotation marks icon will prompt the database to cite the work for you in a wide variety of formats which almost always include APA and Chicago. To double check if they are correct (they do make mistakes on occasion) or if you need to create a citation on your own, Purdue OWL is a highly regarded and widely used reference tool for how to create a citation in a variety of formats including Chicago and APA in academic institutions



Reading list titles are shelved on the 3rd floor; CSA-ASU-CASCOM CG lists are on display and available for circulation.


New Books are shelved on the 2nd and 3rd floor displays.
